

Overview of tuition fees 2023 – 2024

Examination fees for external candidates and course fees for students in 2023-2024	
Examination fees for external candidates Only grants entitlement to take examinations and final exams for initial education. No entitlement to follow education and supervision or use of facilities. As such, work placements, writing a thesis and project teaching are not possible either.	€ 2,977 (previously € 2,842) Payment in instalments not possible
Course fees for initial education Applicable if the conditions for enrolment as a student are not met in time and the student would fall under the conditions of note 2. No exam possible as a student.	€5,921 (previously €5,653) The administrative costs for payment in instalments are € 24.

Institutional tuition fees 2023-2024	
For Dutch and international students who do not meet the 2 basic criteria of note 1 and for students who have previously completed a customised programme at the university of applied sciences against the statutory tuition fees and for that reason alone do not meet the second criterion.	
The institutional tuition fees exclude any government contribution. The level of the regular fee is approximately equal to the average amount of the statutory tuition fees per students, plus the average government contribution per student per year. For part-time programmes, the study load per year is also taken into account partly. The administrative costs for payment in instalments are € 24.

Note 1 Nationality requirements; no degree yet, unless

Only the following persons are eligible for these tuition, course and examination fees. These are persons who:

1. Belong to one of the groups of persons referred to in Section 2.2(1) of the Student Finance Act 2000 (please see the explanatory notes below) or hold Surinamese nationality; and

2. According to BRON HO have not yet obtained a degree in higher education when enrolling for an Associate Degree, have not yet obtained a Bachelor's degree when enrolling for a Bachelor's programme and who have not yet obtained a Master's degree (or successfully completed a final exam equivalent to the Bachelor's and Master's degree) at a government-funded institution. Applicants must inform Inholland of all degrees obtained/to be obtained prior to the enrolment date (or at least all completed programmes at research universities and universities of applied sciences), so that it can assess whether a degree has already been obtained. If at a later stage it becomes apparent that the absence of a degree was assumed erroneously, the student will retroactively be subject to the institutional tuition fees and shall owe these fees to the university of applied sciences.
Exception: The 2nd condition does not apply to student who are enrolling for a teacher training or healthcare programme for the first time (meaning that they have already obtained a degree, but not for a programme in those sectors). Students with a certificate for a so-called customised programme of a legal predecessor of the university of applied sciences, which according to BRON HO falls under a teacher training or healthcare programme, are eligible under certain conditions for a reduced institutional tuition fee when registering for a teacher training or healthcare programme.

Explanatory notes to 'groups of persons'

The groups of persons in Section 2.2(1) of the *Student Finance Act 2000*, in summary, relate to:

- a. Persons who hold an EEA or Swiss nationality;
- b. Persons who hold Turkish nationality: children of (former) employees who live in a Member State where they work or have worked;
- c. Family members of EU citizens living in the Netherlands who hold a non-EEA nationality. The term family members means:
 - the spouse or partner with whom the citizen of the Union has entered into a registered partnership in accordance with the laws of that country, insofar as this equated with marriage and the relevant conditions are met; and
 - a direct descendant as well as that of the partner under the age of 21 or who is dependent on them;
- d. Holders of an EU residence permit for long-term residents and persons who are nationals of a third country (non-EU Member States) and who have the status of long-term residents in another EU Member State and who receive a residence permit in the Netherlands (and therefore live in the Netherlands);
- e. Foreign nationals with an asylum residence permit (fixed-term or permanent) or regular (permanent or fixed-term, subject to certain conditions);
- f. Foreign nationals awaiting the granting or extension of the residence permit, insofar as they already benefit from student grants;
- g. Foreign nationals who have previously received an allowance under the Educational Contribution and School Fees Allowance Act (*Wet tegemoetkoming onderwijsbijdrage en schoolkosten*).
- h. Students that hold British nationals (subjects of the United Kingdom) who have lawfully and continuously resided in the Netherlands before the reference date of 1 January 2021.
